Guy was many things, but most of all he was a truly generous and compassionate soul. For instance, he left really large tips. He felt a few extra dollars to show his appreciation was the thing to do and might make somebody's day.

Back in the hippie days, Guy was the quintessential mountain man. He hitchhiked all around America with his beloved dog, Japhy Ryder, named after a character in Jack Kerouac's novel *The Dharma Bums*. Guy was on the road for years and had the tales to go with it. Although *On The Road* was written when Guy was only 5 years old, one could see a lot of him in that story. Guy was truly a "mad one" in the best sense of the phrase.

Guy was once described as a "jazz talker" because his stories flowed as melodiously as a beautiful tune. He could captivate a crowd with an interesting anecdote, go off on many tangents, and then somehow return to the original tale. In the end, it was always a story you would remember. He was an avid reader and a trivia expert - combined with his social skills, Guy had the ability to talk to anyone. He was just plain fun.

It is hard to put into words all the things one could say about Guy. Saying commonplace things like he was an amazing husband, loving father, devoted brother and great friend doesn't seem like enough, even though they are all true. If you got the chance to meet

him, you met someone unique and special. There will never be another Guy Loughran.
