“ Thanks to you Carol for your kind words. I was recently informed of my mother’s passing by an unrelated party. Families have differences, even lose touch altogether, but I would like to offer what I can in remembrance.

My mother and father moved to Cairo in about 1947, the year I was born. When I was 4 years old, my brother 10, we had a family meeting. The question put to us was whether we would rather Mom stayed at home or went to work for the school so we could have a new TV. We were kids and we weren’t going to be home during the day. As you might guess, the answer “TV” was pretty quick. She went to work for Cairo Central School as the Office Manager and Secretary to the Principal that fall of 1952 and continued until circa 1977 when she retired. From beginning to end, she was a valuable member of the school system, liked, and respected, and depended upon by her colleagues. There was never a duty or responsibility that she shirked or did half way.

She was just as hard working on the home front. Even when we were too young to start dinner, she managed to have a home cooked meal ready to go on the table by the time my father came in the door. We always had clean clothes, a clean house, and whatever else we needed.

As well as working for the school and being a parent and wife, she was very active in the community and in her beloved Easter Stars, serving several times as Matron. She was a woman of substance.
