I had the honor of working in the same firehouse with Kenny during the 70’s. He served in Ladder 112 during its busiest years and was a stalwart warrior in the firestorm that swept through Bushwick. Kenny was a dynamic firefighter who was resilient and inventive. Besides shouldering the hooks, halligan tools and axes provided by the FD, Kenny kept all manner of handy tools in his helmet and in extra pockets which he had sewn into his turnout coat. He pioneered using a really portable mask and face-piece years before the FD caught onto the idea.
Although I haven’t seen Kenny in a very long time, I will always remember him as supportive colleague, who put the accent on the positive.
I am sorry that I am unable to attend the memorial service, but at least I can share this memory of Kenny after so many years.
