Words cannot express the sorrow I feel.

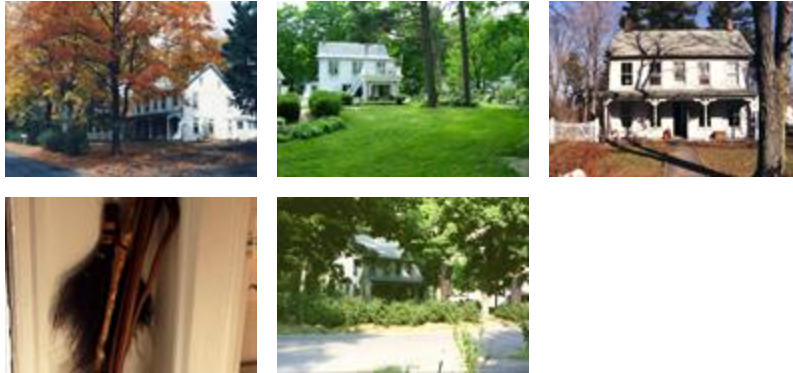
And, I won't attempt a description of how kind or good person a person she was. It would be inadequate.

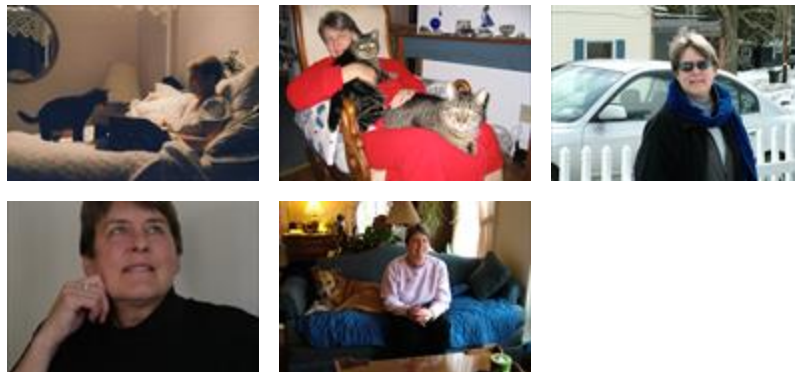
