Lawrence Joseph “Scotty” McCarroll 92, passed away at his home on December 7, 2025.

Born in Glasgow, Scotland on November 9, 1933, he was the son of Patrick and Bridget McCarroll.

Larry is survived by his loving wife of 52 years, Patricia (Alcuri) McCarroll. He also leaves behind his devoted son, Lawrence Patrick, wife Jill, along with his beautiful granddaughters Abigail and Emily, and nieces and nephews. Larry is preceded in death by his parents, brother Edwin, and sisters, Evelyn, Patricia, and Veronica.

Larry moved to the United States from Scotland in 1968, living with his sister in Leeds. During this time he met his future wife Patty. He was employed by Conrail, as a breakman-conductor for nineteen years. After leaving Conrail, Scotty worked

as a golf ranger for twenty years at Sunny Hill Golf Course which he thoroughly enjoyed. Larry loved music. He brought his accordion from Scotland, and played for many years. He loved playing golf trying to conquer that game. He enjoyed traveling with his wife Patty and watching all the Yankee games on television.

He enjoyed the visits from his son and family. Larry was an honorary member of the Catskill Elks Club, the Knights of Columbus, and a parishioner of St. Mary's Church, Coxsackie, New York.

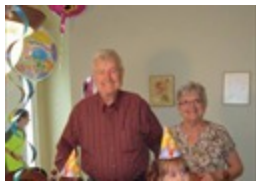
