



Patrick Joseph Thomas McLaughlin

March 31, 1950 - February 11, 2019

Loving father and loyal husband, Patrick Joseph McLaughlin of Acra, NY passed away on February 11th, 2019 at the age of 68. He was born in 1950 in Brooklyn, NY. He served in the Army during the Vietnam War. He was a field radio repairman stationed in South Korea and served for two years. He married his wife, Linda on May 12th, 1973. Pat worked for Amtrak as a Lead Service Attendant for over 35 years and also volunteered as a union representative for the Transit Workers Union, Local 1460. He loved bowling, and skiing but mostly he loved golf. During his recreational career he bowled a 300 game and made a hole-in-one (a feat with odds of 1 in 12,000 rounds). He also had a passion for wearing unique hats and feeding the birds. Pat was preceded in death by his father, Joseph and his mother, Catherine. He is survived by Linda, his daughter, Pattilyn, his siblings, Edward, Joe, and Lucy and several nieces and nephews. Those who knew him knew he loved to laugh and make others laugh. He was known for his comedic timing and aptitude for service. He was a great man, father, friend, and husband. He will be dearly missed.
