Richard E. Vigilo, age 83 years, formerly of Scarsdale, N.Y., presently of Cairo, N.Y. since the 1960's, passed away on January 10, 2021, at Columbia Memorial Hospital, Hudson, N.Y.

Richard was born on April 24, 1937, in Mount Vernon, New York, and is the son of the late Richard R. and Martha M. (Perone) Vigilo.

Besides his parents, Richard is predeceased by several aunts, uncles, cousins, and dear friends and neighbors of the community, of whom he loved. Richard especially has missed his former business partner Vincent J. Valenti, who passed away on December 20, 1992, who was a N.Y.S. Licensed Funeral Director and Vice President of Richards Funeral Home of the Mid-Hudson Valley, Inc. and President of Richards Ambulance Service, of whom Richard shared many happy memories with and enjoyed caring for those in the community alongside one another.

Survivors include Richard's Staff of Richards Funeral Home of the Mid-Hudson Valley, Inc., of whom Richard considered his family, and many friends and neighbors of the community. Richard also leaves behind his beloved toy poodle Fame, whom he enjoyed immensely for over ten years.

Funeral Home, Inc. located in Coxsackie, N.Y., Former Owner of the Valenti and Richards Funeral Home located in Hudson, N.Y., Former Vice President of Richards Ambulance Service, owner and operator of Richards Ambulette Service, and the Greene County Car Service, also Richard was Chief Greene County Coroner since 1998 serving the community with dignity and compassion at all times.

Richard served his country proudly in The United States Army National Guard, serving from January 18, 1960- January 31, 1966.

Richard was a member of The Sacred Heart Church, Cairo, N.Y. for many years.

Richard held several memberships in many organizations including the following. Richard held the position of Past President of The Cairo Rotary Club, Cairo, N.Y., The Knights of Columbus Lady of Knock Council in East Durham, N.Y., Loyal Order of Moose in Hudson, N.Y., The N.Y.S. “ I met Richard only once in 2015, after my brother passed away at home. But that one meeting with Richard left such an impression that I’ve told the story of that encounter to many people along the way. I’d like to tell the story here again—a dog story, really. Barry, a middle-aged bachelor, lived alone with his beloved German Shepherd. He was deceased for two days before his body was discovered. I didn’t know until the police showed up at three o’clock in the morning and, well, everyone knows a knock at the door in the dead of night never brings good news. All the local cops could tell me was that the dog was guarding the body and the coroner hadn’t been able to go in until animal control arrived. In that dreadful moment of shocked grief, all I could think about was getting to Holly, his dog. My brother always said, “If anything ever happens, I don’t care what you do with me—just make sure Holly’s okay.” I made the two-hour drive at sunrise and met the animal control officer in town that morning. He escorted me to a county building, and there I found her in a near catatonic state, cowering in the cement corner of a chain-link kennel (boy, was she ever glad to see me!). I figured she hadn’t eaten in days, so on our way to the funeral home we stopped at a drive-thru for two egg McMuffins. I couldn’t eat mine, and watched through tears as she devoured both, alternately chewing and whining her lament. Then I called Richard to say I was on my way. Richard rushed out when my car pulled up. “Where’s Holly?” he asked. I was taken aback. “How do you know my brother had a dog?” (I didn’t realize he was also the coroner). “And how do you know her name?” “Well,” Richard said, “the animal control officer introduced us. It seems he and Holly are on a first name basis—something to do with her recent rendezvous with a neighbor’s chickens.” “Oh.” My brother had neglected to tell me about her run-in with the law.” Richard proceeded to invite Holly inside, which completely amazed me. I didn’t want to impose, and told him she’d be fine sitting in the

car while I made arrangements.

But Richard insisted. "Do you know how traumatized that dog was? Poor baby! Please, bring her in."

And so I did. She let Richard pet her, then sat with her body pressed against me while he asked questions about arrangements, and about what would happen to Holly. I remember thinking, wow, my brother would have really liked this guy! If his spirit was anywhere in the vicinity, I'm sure he was deeply appreciative of Richard's compassion and genuine concern. I found it absolutely endearing. I explained that my brother and Holly spent lots of weekends with me and my own dogs in our Berkshire house, and assured him that she would be coming to live with us. "She's my niece, after all," I said. Richard was relieved to hear this, of course, and toward the end of our meeting he talked about his love of animals, about his poodles past and present, and showed me pictures of his precious white poodle, Fame.

I'm thinking about "Famey" now, and how she must be missing her dog-dad immensely. Just as Richard's heart went out to my brother's dog, today my heart goes out to that sweet little poodle, and to all of you there who grief the absence of a very kind, one-of-a-kind guy.

In his memory, Holly and I have made a donation to Animal Kind in Hudson, NY.

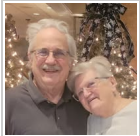
