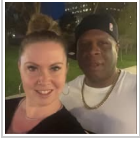

I could tell instantly that she was about to embark on a new journey that no one is ever fully prepared to walk. What I did notice as well was her smile. Our eyes met and with a bit of hesitancy she smiled at me and I felt a wave of comfort come over me. I’m not new to the treatment quad, been fighting battles over the years there, kind of like a second home to me but I always have comprehension when I walk through those doors. That feeling of comfort Tammy so gracefully gave me immediately put me at ease and I knew right away that Tammy and I would become fast friends. As I sat in my treatment chair, got settled, Tammy noticed the nurses having a very difficult time getting a vein, I think the nurse came out in her (not knowing her background) and she immediately took my mind off of it by starting a conversation with me. Here she was new at being the patient and she didn’t hesitate to comfort me. That told me Tammy was someone extra special. I thought, “God is at work again, He sent one of his Warrior Angels here to bring peace within our quad.” How blessed were we to have Tammy among us? I thought and thanked Him for doing so. I noticed a young woman with Tammy, trying to do everything she could to make her mom comfortable and prepared for what was to come. She was a younger version of her mom, radiating love and compassion. It was beautiful to see the love between the two and the respect you could tell that was there for what they, as a team, were going to go through together. I always love to see family fighting battles together, an army of one. I came to know Nicole quickly, having a daughter her age as well, knowing that this must be scary and difficult to see her mom go through. Though you would never know it, because Nicole, she was a strong willed and determined soldier ready to battle for her mom. Over the many weeks of war, sometimes together and sometimes through text messages and Facebook, we became a family. Supporting, loving and encouraging each other. What I am most grateful for is the love

and dedication Tammy and Nicole always have had for the Lord. Their faith, their trust in Him. Tammy and I often spoke of our foundation that was getting us through and that was faith and family. I always loved talking with Tammy because I knew God was working through her, not only helping her but giving her the gift to help others with His word, His grace and His mercy. We became to be known at NYOH as the Quad Squad. With Tammy as the Light of group, our dear sister, Debbie Hill who is fighting the fight of her life, as the outspoken one, Nicole as our reminder of the blessed innocence of life that we each hold within that God gifted to us, and myself in tow. I drew so much inspiration and strength from Tammy. She always was there for me, during the most challenging days. I knew I could send a message and with her reply she instantly put me at ease, reminding me of God's promises. I honestly feel in my heart Tammy was sent here for many reasons but also to do God's work. I was blessed personally with Tammy in my life. I will forever be thankful for the friendship, the love, the compassion she covered me with. I will cherish the gift of our relationship. I know her light will continue to shine through her loved ones. I am forever thankful for the gift of my friendship with Nicole that Tammy has left with me.
