Thomas C. Geiselhart, 90, of Naples, Florida, passed away peacefully at home in Naples, FL. He was born on December 28, 1934, in Ellenville, New York, to the late George W. Geiselhart and Gwendolyn Geiselhart.

He was a member of Hudson Valley Umpires Association for many years and parishioner of both Sacred Heart church in Cairo, NY and St. Leo's church in Bonita Springs, FL. His hobbies included baseball, golf and playing pinochle. He was a member of Schmollinger's golf club in Freehold and later San Carlos golf club in FL. He served several terms on the Board of Directors for both his condo association and golf club.
